## **A letter from the Chair of SACRE**

I am pleased to introduce the Redcar and Cleveland Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education (SACRE) Annual Report for the academic year 2016/17. SACRE has met three times this year.

The membership of SACRE is comprised of representatives of some of the faith communities in Redcar and Cleveland, a Humanist representative, a teacher professional association and the Local Authority. We continue to actively seek to welcome representatives of different faiths and the teacher professional associations to further enhance the breadth of discussion at meetings and the knowledge and diversity of the Committee.

SACRE is legally required by law to produce an Annual Report each year. This report has to be sent to the Secretary of State for Education as well as to key partners, including schools, teacher training institutions, libraries and councillors. The main purpose of the Report is to hold the Local Authority to account, by informing the Secretary of State and key partners what advice SACRE gave the LA during the year and how that was responded to; this includes advice on RE and Collective Worship in those schools for which the LA has responsibility.

In April 2015, we launched the revised Redcar and Cleveland Agreed Syllabus. Members of SACRE worked alongside primary and secondary teachers to produce a curriculum framework that is helpful to teachers in planning progressive RE lessons. The Agreed Syllabus revision requires children to become aware of secular worldviews. In this respect, a training session for teachers took place in the Autumn Term 2015 on the Humanist worldview. A decision was made not to alter the assessment criteria until a clearer picture emerged as to how schools would tackle the removal of levels. Schools are now working on an approach to assessment based on Assessment without levels. SACRE is very grateful for the support it has received from our teachers in producing the revised Agreed Syllabus as there exists no funding for a specialist RE teacher advisor. SACRE no longer has an independent budget and therefore schools need to pay for any training schools and teachers ask SACRE to provide. Individual members of SACRE are prepared to support schools in any way they can. Requests can be through SACRE's LA representative, Pauline Jackson.

## **Religious Education**

### The local agreed syllabus

The Agreed Syllabus was launched in April 2015 to all Primary and Secondary schools in the Local Authority. Meetings with teachers took place after the launch in order to clarify the syllabus. The syllabus was approved by the SACRE at the Spring meeting.

There is a continuing need to revise the assessment standards in line with school and DfE guidelines. During this academic year, RE leads will develop a system based on 'age related expectations,' for each year group. The first development session will be held on the 24<sup>th</sup> January 2017,

In addition, all school RE leads will be invited to attend termly update sessions. These sessions will focus on recent developments, updates from national events and curriculum requirements.

### Standards in Religious Education

All schools receiving a 2 day OFSTED monitoring visit, in this time frame, have been rated 'Good' or 'Outstanding' for personal development, behaviour and welfare.

### Monitoring of RE

The monitoring of RE in Redcar and Cleveland will be undertaken as part of the meetings with RE leads and further developed through the termly Headteacher cluster meetings. The Chair of the local SACRE has met headteachers at the cluster meetings.

From September 2016, all schools will be requested to complete a SACRE form to monitor any pupil withdrawals from RE and/or complaints about collective worship. This will then be a permanent agendas' item, based on these submissions. The form for 2016 has been completed, a summary of which is included in this report.

### Complaints

No formal complaints have been made to SACRE, concerning Religious Education or Collective Worship, during the academic year 2016/ 2017.

## Methods of Teaching, The Choice of Teaching Materials, Teacher Training

The Agreed Syllabus is sent to all schools in Redcar and Cleveland and is a comprehensive document designed and written by practising teachers for teachers. The Agreed Syllabus is used by maintained and special schools as well as some academies.

The Redcar and Cleveland SCITT will use the Agreed Syllabus with their primary and secondary students in the new academic year.

## Community Cohesion

SACRE continues to have a commitment to Community Cohesion and is willing to support schools in fulfilling their statutory duties. In order to have a more comprehensive oversight, SACRE will work with the LA prevent and cohesion team.

## Collective Worship

### Advice on Collective Worship

SACRE guidance continues to be used in local schools as the basis for their arrangements for Collective Worship.

## Training

Due to continued cuts in local authority funding there is no designated CPD for RE across the Borough. However, schools have requested the establishment of Networks for teachers and RE leaders in both Primary and Secondary Schools. These networks have now been established and will continue to grow and develop through the academic year. In addition to the above, the chair of SACRE and the local LA representative have arranged teacher CPD from an external supplier. The initial training, for all staff in schools, will take place on the 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2017.

## Determinations

No determinations have been applied for.

## Complaints and Withdrawals

Following the SACRE survey completed by schools, it was noted that 2 children were withdrawn from RE and 2 complaints were made regarding RE.

## **Finance**

Redcar & Cleveland SACRE has not been allocated a dedicated budget. However, financial support is provided from within the LA's central budget to meet the costs of supporting the group, such as clerking meetings, administrative support, subscription to NASACRE and expenses for members' attendance at relevant conferences and training.
