Stockport Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education

Annual Report September 2010 - August 2011

SACRE stands for Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education. In 1988 all local education authorities were required to have a SACRE. The main function of SACRE is to advise its local authority on matters related to religious education (RE) and collective worship for schools in its area. Through SACRE, local communities have the opportunity to influence directly what pupils learn in RE. Elected councillors, representatives of faith communities and teachers are among those members of the local community who sit on SACRE.

1. Activities of Stockport SACRE during the academic year 2010-2011

Stockport SACRE met three times, 5th October 2010, 29th March 2011, and 21st June 2011, and the Agreed Syllabus Conference with similar membership met twice on 30th Nov 2010, and 9th March 2011.

During this period via a continued collaborative approach between Manchester, Salford, Stockport, Tameside and Trafford local authorities and consultants, an agreed syllabus for Religious Education 2011 in schools was drafted and through its various stages was seen by and commented upon by Stockport SACRE at its meetings. After much discussion, the final version has now been approved for adoption as of 1st September 2011 and it is intended that the 2011 Stockport Agreed Syllabus and supporting guidance materials will be published on the School and Community Workforce Website open for access by users both within and outside of Stockport. Training was delivered in July 2011 by teacher representatives to both the Primary and Secondary sectors.

Following the government publication of the 2010 non statutory guidance for Religious Education in English Schools a request had been received seeking full membership for the Humanist representative to the SACRE Committee A. (See membership list). Following clarification from NASACRE and in line with current legislation it was agreed that the representative would continue as a co-opted member.

Stockport SACRE unanimously agreed to contribute towards membership of The National Association of SACREs (NASACRE) and has received confirmation of its continuing affiliation.

Stockport SACRE liaised with Stockport Inter-Faith Network in National Inter-Faith Week 21-27 November 2010. The programme for the main event included items from children and young people across schools and faiths represented in Stockport and was very successful.

There has been continuing discussion regarding the place and importance of RE in schools in relation to the core curriculum for schools under review by central government.

2. Stockport SACRE continues to monitor RE examination results across Stockport Schools. A table of results for GSCE in RE in Stockport 2008-2010 (Key Stage 4) is appended to this report. There were 11 schools who offered RE at GSCE and 3 who did not. It was noted that the RE short course was diminishing and concerns were raised over the impact that the DfE introduction of an EBacc performance measure may have on RE studies and qualifications.

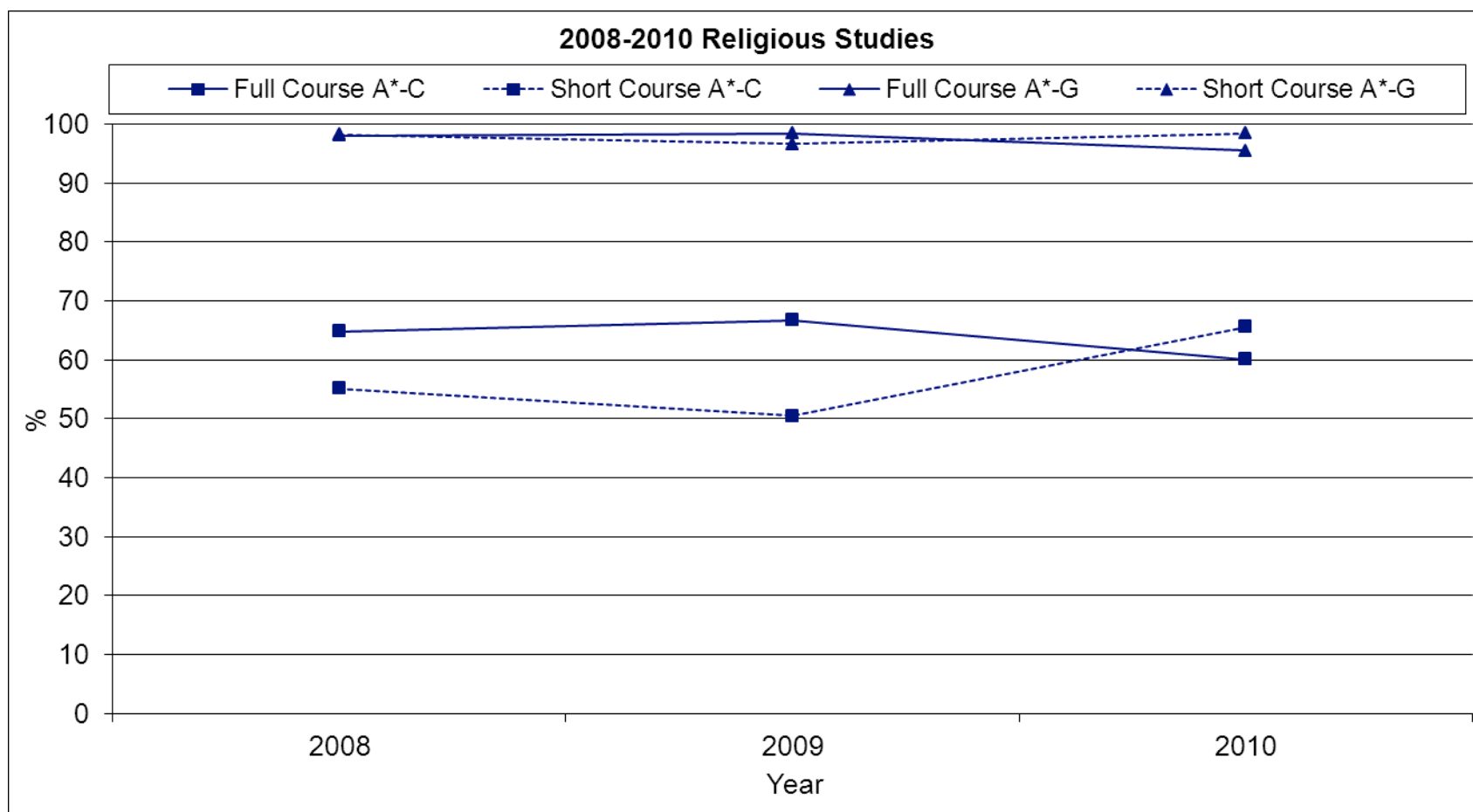
