ANNUAL REPORT 2014-15



Our combined RE teacher's network meetings across Poole and Bournemouth continue to offer support and advice to teachers on approaches to RE in the classroom. We have had a long association with Jan Lever's Consultancy with many schools using the support handbook that she wrote called 'Discovery' which supports Bournemouth and Poole's Agreed Syllabus. Jan will be leading us through the process of revising the locally Agreed Syllabus, as you can see below.

Rubina and I have not been able to attend the South Central SACRE Hub which consists of SACRE chairs and RE advisors from Bournemouth, Dorset, Hampshire, Isle of Wight, Poole, Portsmouth, Reading, Southampton, Surrey, West Berkshire, West Sussex, Wiltshire and Wokingham due to ill health and the fact they tend to have their meeting on a day that it not always convenient This is a good forum to discuss common issues and share training opportunities and I do intend attending when I can in the future!

The main focus of our activities this year has been on establishing an Agreed Syllabus Conference (ASC) to review the Agreed Syllabus for RE adopted by the Local Authority. This has common membership with the SACRE but is a separate entity and therefore has its own schedule of meetings. As we share the same syllabus with Poole we are working on the new Agreed Syllabus in conjunction with Poole SACRE. Jan Lever has already begun the consultation process on the new Agreed Syllabus draft. Following the meeting held on 3rd December at the Bournemouth Learning Centre, when we discussed the potential amendments to the current RE agreed syllabus, people present requested a further meeting to give more time to consider the first draft and discussed amendments, and to come back together to feed back and take the review forward. This second meeting was scheduled for Tuesday January 19th at the Bournemouth Islamic Centre and Central Mosque (BICCM).

In revising our local syllabus we will be taking account of developments both nationally and internationally, particularly the need to promote British Values and ensure that children and young people have a clear understanding of the place of religion and other world views in their lives and in the wider world.

As Ramadan was from 17th June until 17th July last year we sent a letter to all head teachers making them aware of the Health and Safety aspects of young Muslim children who might be trying to fast during the long hours of day light. Ramadan this year starts on Tuesday, June 7, 2016 and continues until about July 7th.

I would like to thank all those who have worked so hard to support the delivery of high quality Religious Education in our schools and the work of SACRE – particularly those who organised events, and once again a big thank you to Rubina and Margaret for their excellent support throughout the year! Rubina finished in her role as RE Adviser on December 31st, I am sure you would want to join me in wishing her all the very best for the future.
