The context of our journey: National Picture:

It is a statutory subject BUT...

...it sits outside the National Curriculum and is locally determined.

'RE must be taught to all registered pupils in maintained school except those withdrawn by their parents'

The Education Act, 2002, section 80

The SACRE's duty is to monitor and SUPPORT



The essential support must have regard to:

- a) RE in English Schools: Non-statutory guidance 2010 (Wokingham agreed syllabus follows the above)
- b) A curriculum framework for RE in England 2013 (still non-statutory) Religious Education Council (with foreword by Michael Gove)
- c) All Party Parliamentary Group formed 2013
- d) Ofsted reports on RE: 2010 and 2013
- e) ESAG Expert Subject Advisory Group formed 2014 (to issue guidance 2014-15)



RE: realising the potential (Ofsted 2013)

Weaknesses include:

- Teachers' understanding of the subject
- Lack of emphasis on pupils' subject knowledge
- Fragmented curriculum planning
- Weak assessment
- Ineffective monitoring
- Limited access to training

Enquiry approach recommended

SACRE action plan tries to address this. HOW?



Step 1

Step 3

- Development of additional website space for RE on the Wokingham Borough website:
- Share ideas/good practice
- SACRE and Faith calendar: local and national events and festival dates/ directory of places

- **Future plans** include: pilot scheme for faith ambassadors, students on SACRE, and directory of speakers.

What is a SACRE?

Every Local Authority is legally obliged to set up, support and maintain its own SACRE; this is a council with a specific constitution bringing together elected members of local government, teachers, members of faith and belief communities and where possible, students.

What must a SACRE do?

The remit of a SACRE is twofold: to monitor and support the delivery of Religious Education and Collective Worship in the schools in that area and to provide the locally agreed syllabus for RE, which is reviewed every 5 years.

The Wokingham SACRE appreciates and benefits from ongoing funding and support from the LA, and works closely with the Diocese of Oxford and faith and belief communities including interfaith fora.

It is also a member of NASACRE (the National Association of SACREs) and members attend annual conferences and annual general meetings.

What does the Wokingham SACRE do?

The main responsibility of the SACRE is to provide a locally agreed syllabus for Religious Education for the schools in the area. This must be reviewed every 5 years and it is the obligation of each LA school to fulfil the requirements set out in it. Academies are vericome to use it but, while they must also provide RE for their pupils, they have autonomy in ferms of the syllabus they follow and the scheme of work they devise. However, many academies choose to follow the locally agreed syllabus.

Likewise, many faith schools choose to adopt their locally agreed syllabus even though their RE may be more aligned to their faith and/or denomination e.g. many Church schools follow the agreed syllabus whilst supplementing it with additional metrial on Christianity.

The Pan-Berkshire Agreed Syllabus for RE was launched in 2012 and will be reviewed in 2017. The syllabus has been very well-received and the enquiry-based model it recommends is proving valuable in improving children's and young people's critical and
